Discussed the Board of Education (BOE) , Operation Change, due to the Budget

Selection of possible changes and upcoming board issues, due to the budget shrinkage

- Montgomery county does not have a fully funded budget, there are changes and cuts
- Decrease in staff allotments
- Decrease in Media Assistants
- Decrease in school administration
- Decrease in security staff
- ESOL student ratios would change
- Decrease in english comprehension teachers
- Eliminating after school buses
- Decrease budget of school sports, especially non varsity
- Decreasing building maintenance
- Decreasing and changing the special education staff ratios
- Staff salaries, no increase 3 years in a row
- Increase in health care cost for staff
- Staff gives more than one hundred percent and it is difficult to keep morale, with both no raises and changes in their available resources.

Sherwood High School Enrollment

The 2010-11 school year: initially was 2,070 students presently we are at 2,113 students

140 student variance

Class sizes are 30-33 students

** Parents should register their student for Sherwood HS even if they end up going to a local private school

The Sherwood student registry is based on a 1970 survey; there is always a danger that teachers could be lost waiting on updated student counts.

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Class Grading /Reporting Changes

- Parents brought up that they would like the county to consider changing letter grades to percentages grades , rather than the current straight A,B,C letter grading. Currently there is no point disparity in the straight letter grades, you could receive high or low points and still receive the same letter within that grade.

AP/ Honors Courses:

Advanced Placement Coursed:

- Approved by many colleges
- Risk free
- Helps students achieve more in college
- Sherwood staff really encourage their students to take these courses
- The Honors classes help the students be better prepared for the AP curriculum coursework
- English 11th year classes are currently only given as either an Honors or AP class, no grade level, special aides are in the classroom for assistance
- Montgomery county class of 2010 – AP exams
 - 66.1% of all students took AP's exams in the county
 - 62.3% at Sherwood HS took AP exams, we were slightly below the average, Sherwood ranked 10th in the county
- AP exams cost \$87 per exam, which is a parental responsibility
